Minutes from the February 13th 2024 General Meeting not available but will be presented at the next General Meeting on April 9th 2024.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

St Patrick's Day is also being celebrated here at our Branch with stew, rolls, dessert and tea/coffee being served in the Webb Room at a cost of \$ 8.00 Also stew and a roll only will be served in the Bar at a cost of \$ 5.00.

Last Sunday's Brunch was attended by 179 people. We seem to be going through more food, but the same number of people. We have placed signs on the tables stating that "We are pleased that you enjoy our food and wish for seconds. Please consider making a donation for your seconds." Our donations were a bit more, but we might have to consider altering the amount we do serve. It will be looked into and discussed further.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Shirley Howard gave the financial report and noted that we did not lose for the month of January but this was due to the generous donation of \$ 8000 by the Ladies Auxiliary.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Shirley Howard reported that we have received a request from the MARC Group which has teamed up with the Gananoque Fire Department requesting the Legion become a Sponsor to their Community Program. The Sponsorship entry level is \$550 and each level increases dramatically upward. It was suggested that we approach the Gananoque Fire Department itself and inquire what we can possibly consider doing for them instead of committing to this program. This is tabled till next month.
